ARE UNIONS LEGAL?

Yes! The NLRB protects private sector workers' right to unionize and state laws protect public workers (like us)!

It is illegal for employers to engage in discrimination or retribution towards employees for participating in unionizing efforts.

CAN GRAD STUDENTS FORM A UNION?

Yes! ISU grad students paid by the university for their Graduate Assistant work (including international students!!) are public sector employees of lowa.

As public sector employees, we have the right to organize (form a union) and engage in collective bargaining under Iowa Code

Through collective bargaining, we can negotiate terms and conditions including... compensation, work schedules, leave/time off, safety rules, benefits, and more!

Provide a powerful grievance procedure to address issues such as discrimination, lack of worker's compensation, and not being recognized as employees.
